



ARE YOU A MUSICIAN, SONGWRITER, PRODUCER, INDEPENDENT LABEL OWNER, OR OTHER INDIVIDUAL INVOLVED IN THE MUSIC INDUSTRY AND NOT CURRENTLY REPRESENTED BY AN ATTORNEY?

If so, you may be eligible for free legal services provided by UCLA School of Law's Music Industry Clinic ("MIC"). MIC provides free legal services for qualifying musicians and other members of the music industry in the Los Angeles area. At the same time, MIC provides UCLA Law students with the opportunity to represent clients in real-life music transactional matters under the supervision of experienced music attorneys.

MIC is currently accepting applicants for services to be provided in the Spring 2018 semester.

If you're interested in applying for representation by MIC, you can apply by doing the following:

2. Go to the "Academics" drop down menu
3. Go to "Clinical & Experimental Programs"
4. Then go to "Music Industry Clinic"

Once we've reviewed your application, we'll let you know if your matter meets our criteria and we have the capacity to handle it. If the answer to those questions is yes, the next step will be an in-person meeting between you and our student practitioners and a supervising attorney. After that, we will determine whether MIC will represent you going forward.
